

1 Republic of Iran or any part of its government or military,
2 including potential ground forces in a combat role or used
3 for occupation, unless explicitly authorized by a declara-
4 tion of war or specific authorization for use of military
5 force against Iran.

6 (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-
7 tion may be construed to—

8 (1) prevent the United States from defending
9 itself, its Armed Forces, its diplomatic facilities, or
10 allied states from imminent attack;

11 (2) prevent the United States Armed Forces
12 from maintaining a troop presence in the region for
13 defensive purposes; or

14 (3) force the removal of United States Armed
15 Forces in the region who are not engaged in hos-
16 tilities against Iran.

17 RULE OF CONSTRUCTION RELATING TO INTELLIGENCE

19 SEC. 2.

20 Nothing in this resolution may be construed to influ-
21 ence or disrupt any intelligence, counterintelligence, or in-
22 vestigative activities relating to threats in or emanating
23 from Iran or surrounding countries conducted by, or in
24 conjunction with, the United States Government involv-
25 ing—

26 (1) the collection of intelligence;

1 (2) the analysis of intelligence; or

2 (3) the sharing of intelligence between the
3 United States and any coalition partner, if the
4 President determines such sharing is appropriate
5 and in the national security interests of the United
6 States.

7 RULE OF CONSTRUCTION RELATING TO

8 NONAUTHORIZATION OF THE USE OF MILITARY FORCE

9 SEC. 3.

10 Consistent with section 8(a)(1) of the War Powers
11 Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1547(a)(1)), nothing in this concur-
12 rent resolution may be construed as authorizing the use
13 of military force.
